

OXYGEN BLEACH BRANDS

PRESSURE WASHING

DANGERS & VIDEOS





Oxygen bleach is a magical multi-purpose cleaner. You can use it to clean just about anything that's water washable. The most powerful products - *those with the highest concentration of made-in-the-USA active ingredient* - can remove tough stains from things that other oxygen bleach cleaners can't touch.

IMPORTANT NOTE: BEWARE of independent blogs or websites that list different oxygen bleaches and puts them into categories or review the products. ***You don't know who owns those websites and one of the oxygen bleach manufacturers could be behind the biased content.*** The information you see at some of these mysterious blogs might not be accurate.

IMPORTANT ADVICE: When you compare prices of different oxygen bleaches, you can use price to help guide you as to which one has the most active ingredient. The most expensive oxygen bleach on a per-pound basis almost always has the highest amount of certified organic active ingredient.

Non-organic oxygen bleaches can contain sub-standard active ingredients and small amounts of the active ingredient. In other words, you might be buying lots of filler.

Here's a list of the oxygen bleach brands I was able to discover as of April, 2018:

Stain Solver: Stain Solver is a ***certified organic*** oxygen bleach made in the USA with USA ingredients. It has an extremely high amount of active ingredient and a small amount of pure soda ash. The soda ash boosts the alkalinity of the product and helps its performance.

The active ingredient is expensive and is why Stain Solver is more expensive than other brands. **Stain Solver was the ONLY certified organic product I could locate.**

More powerful active ingredient means you need to use LESS of a product than one with a much smaller amount. Keep that in mind when comparing products.

Oxy Boost: This oxygen bleach is produced by a company called Pacific Sands Inc. I searched up and down for any certified organic claim and came up empty-handed.

BioKleen: On all the pages where I saw the product, I couldn't find anything that said it was certified organic. The insanely low price of the product telegraphs to me that it contains much more useless filler than active ingredient.

LA's Totally Awesome Oxygen Base Cleaner: I found this on Amazon.com. Once again, I couldn't locate any claim the product is certified organic.

Just Oxy: Here's another brand I discovered on Amazon.com. All it says is that it's ultra-concentrated. That's a misleading description in my opinion because its price leads me to believe it's ultra-concentrated with lots of FILLER.

Clorox Oxi Magic: It's not certified organic. That tells me the active ingredient is sourced offshore and is not pure enough to get the certification. It's price screams at me that there's much more filler in it than active ingredient.

OxiClean: This is the brand that brought oxygen bleach into the consumer spotlight. There's no indication that it's organic much less certified. Its price is very low. No doubt it's got a very high percentage of inexpensive filler that just takes up space in the container. There's a very good chance the active ingredient is sourced offshore.
